Christopher Dymond, Senior Energy Analyst at the Oregon Department of Energy, will present a seminar for building professionals on "High Performance Homes" from 8am to noon on Friday, July 25, at the Senior Citizens Community Center, 142 NE Dayton in John Day, Oregon.

Oregon builders can receive an Energy Trust of Oregon cash incentive, a \$2000 federal tax credit, and up to \$12,000 state incentive for building a High Performance Home. These houses rely upon systems-engineered design, quality-controlled construction, and performance testing. This results in an environmentally responsible home with increased comfort for homeowners, durable construction, improved moisture control and indoor air quality. These homes use half or less the energy of a conventional home. The presentation covers the technical requirements (e.g. solar integration, etc.) and challenges for homes that are capable of a zero net annual energy use.
